I. Introduction

A. Why we're doing this series.

1. We were made for _____ with God.
Being a Christian is not just about having an explanation of God, it is about having experiences with God that change everything. Heart for the World's mission is to be a church that people don't just hear about God but they _____ God. A top value is a passion for His presence.
2. God isn't just a distant Being who sent prophets to tell us about life, He is a God who came and comes by the Holy Spirit to _____ in our lives. People don't need more laws and advise; they need more God in their life. In fact, it is the time our hurt is the greatest, He draws the nearest. *"The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."* (Psalms 34:18 NIV)
3. Sadly, so many millions hear about Jesus and know about Jesus, but few experience Jesus on a regular basis. This series is about principles for learning how to lean in and receive all of the amazing encounters God has planned for our lives. *"When Jacob awoke from his sleep, he thought, 'Surely the Lord is in this place, and I was not aware of it.'"* (Genesis 28:16 NIV)

4. God never planned for us to think of a radical, supernatural revival life as something weird but as something _____. (Supernaturally Natural) "A miracle a day keeps the devil away." God wants us to begin to expect and press into something more than just the practices and routines of our faith. He wants us to experience the power of our faith by encountering Jesus in all we do. Not just reading the Bible or going to church, but encountering Jesus when we read the Bible and go to church. Don't settle for "normal" Christianity!

B. Today, we want to learn how to encounter God through the infilling and outpouring of the _____ upon our life. *"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere -in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."* (Acts 1:8 NLT)

II. Today, we want to consider the story of an average citizen who became a powerful king by receiving an infilling and impartation of the Holy Spirit. (I Samuel 10:1-6, 20-23 NLT)

Observations about how this encounter impacted Saul, and how we will be changed by being filled and anointed with the Holy Spirit.

- A. The anointing of God made him a completely _____ person, able to be and do what he could've never done.
"At that time the Spirit of the Lord will come powerfully upon you, and you will prophesy with them. You will be changed into a different person." (I Samuel 10:6)

1. God doesn't change us by fixing us but by _____ us. "When Saul and his servant arrived at Gibeah, they saw a group of prophets coming towards them. Then the Spirit of God came powerfully upon Saul, and he, too began to prophesy. When those who knew Saul heard about it, they exclaimed, 'What? Is even Saul a prophet? How did the son of Kish become a prophet?'" (1 Samuel 10:10-11 NLT)
